

Cut out the questions and fold them up as small as possible. Using a funnel, put each question along with some confetti into about 12 or more separate balloons. Blow up the balloons using helium and tie them into a bundle. Tie the bundle on the back of a chair on which the bride-to-be will be seated. Divide the guests into teams and have them take turns selecting a balloon question to pop and answer. The bride-to-be determines correct answers. See website for full instructions.
